
				The BASC provides shelter and welfare facilities for runners and supporters of the event.			
Weather	 Weather conditions on the day can be unpredictable i.e. hot/cold/wet. Conditions for the course can be wet, slippery, muddy, or icy. The course contains some steep sections including the ascent to and descent from the Knoll where slips/trips are known to occur. As the race takes place in November, conditions could be subject to cold conditions where runners could be at risk of hypothermia of the effects of the cold. Waterlogging of the course is possible as the course consists of grass tracks (e.g. through the BASC, Crooked Lane and on the Knoll). Course	Brent Knoll race is a multi-terrain event measuring just under 6-miles in length. Surfaces include road, bridlepath, a grassed field and hard-core trails and will include a significant climb up to the knoll followed by a steep descent to East Brent before returning to the BASC Ground. 	 Surfaces are uneven, such as on the BASC sportsground, Brent Broad Rhyne, and Brent Knoll summit loop. Obstacles on the course including street traffic, kerbs and potholes may also present slip/trip hazards. The course will also include running through gates, which should be open and marshalled for the race. The course is signposted and marshalled as shown on the map below. Landowners contacted to ensure gates are open for the race (e.g. on Brent Broad Rhyne), closed and locked immediately after the race. A finish funnel is in place to manage runners as the end of the course. Roads	 The course has one key road section - Brent Street as runners emerge from Brent Road making their way to the Knoll and back. Vehicles are likely as they drive through the village of Brent Knoll. Course is fully marshalled to warn runners of any oncoming traffic including the road section – see marshal map below. 'Caution runners' signs are displayed to alert drivers, cyclists, public and horse riders. 				 Runners will be briefed to proceed with caution whilst traversing the highway and to always remain vigilant regarding both traffic and adverse terrain. 		
Animals	 Fields on the Knoll are known to have cows/sheep and its possible that runners may encounter livestock on the course. Landowners contacted prior to the event, where required and marshals on the course can alert runners if there is likely contact between runners and animals/livestock. Dog walkers may be present along the course – marshals to alert dog walkers to the presence of approaching runners (Dogs are not allowed on the BASC Grounds). However, runners are briefed to respect other users as they will not have priority over other users. 	Medium	Low		Marshals	
Headquarte rs	 Headquarters is at the BASC sportsground, Stoddens Road, Burnham on Sea. Race Director will be based at the BASC ground throughout the event. Food/Water provisions are available on site, both in the BASC ground for supporters. Runners are provided with refreshments upon completion of the race. 	Low	Low	Car parking is available on the BASC Ground and is marshalled to manage vehicle movements and limit contact with pedestrians. Speeds limits are in place on the grounds too.		


