The first half marathon took place in 1985 and has run every year except for 2020, 2021 and 2022 when the Coronavirus pandemic disrupted and prevented the race. Burnham Harriers have been the event organisers since 2006. Burnham Harriers is an England Athletics affiliated club. The half marathon is licensed through England Athletics and entries are made online through Run Britain. Race organisers conduct regular meetings prior to the event to confirm all race arrangements including first aid, entries, marshal posts, water stations etc. Route is signed with mile markers, and the course is assessed prior to the event to identify possible on the day hazards. Runners	- Race is limited to 500 entrants. - Runners receive a pre-race brief when on the start line just before the race begins. The brief will highlight known hazards i.e. vehicles, public, course terrain, under foot conditions. - Runners will run at their own risk – Risks include possible injury, falls or health issue (mental or physical). - Marshals are posted throughout the course to provide support and respond to runner distress, or emergency. - Marshals are required to remain at their posts to direct runners and ensure that nobody misses key turns or junctions or becomes lost. - Runners are required to record on the reverse of their race numbers or entry form any medical conditions so marshals/race director/first aiders can	Medium	Low	Runners are not permitted to wear headphones - bone conductors are permitted. 	identify any possible conditions or issues which may affect their run. • Race is licensed through Run Britain and is subject to the road race licence guidelines: Race Directors' Club - runbritain • The race has a 3-hour time limit. A tail vehicle follows the runners to ensure their safe completion and return. • By prior arrangement, a few recognised runners start the run at 9:15 to ensure that they complete the course among other runners and before the tail vehicle. The Race Director is informed of those runners granted an early start to identify their presence on the course before all other runners start the half marathon.			Course marshalled 15 marshals throughout the course will carry mobile phones or walkie-talkies to maintain communication with race HQ and Race Director. An appointed first aid provider (Apex first aid) will support the event and be mobile to respond to an accidents/incidents or runner injuries. Weather	- Weather conditions on the day can be unpredictable i.e. hot/cold/wet. - The route is entirely on roads except for the start and end of the course which is on the BASC sports field (outside the cricket pitch boundary). Course may be subject to wet, slippery conditions on both the field and roads. - The half marathon takes place in September; conditions could be subject to cold conditions where runners could be at risk of hypothermia of the effects of the cold. - Extreme weather forecasts to be monitored so decisions can be made to any changes to the race or cancellations. Course was measured and certified in April 2026. • The race is run on roads - main hazards include traffic (along the B3140 Queens Drive to Edithmead Roundabout) and country roads through Brent Knoll, Lympsham and Red Road towards Berrow). • Start and end of course is on grass as the route follows the outer boundary of the cricket pitch. This grassed area can be waterlogged or muddy. • Other hazards on the route will include obstacles on the course including street traffic, kerbs and potholes presenting possible slip/trip hazards. • The full course map showing water stations, marshal posts and directional signs is here: Burnham Half Marathon 2023 - 21km Running Route near Burnham-on-Sea and Highbridge (ID: 2247377) (plotaroute.com) • See further course details on pages 7, 8 and 9. • Runners enter a funnel area as they cross the finish line. 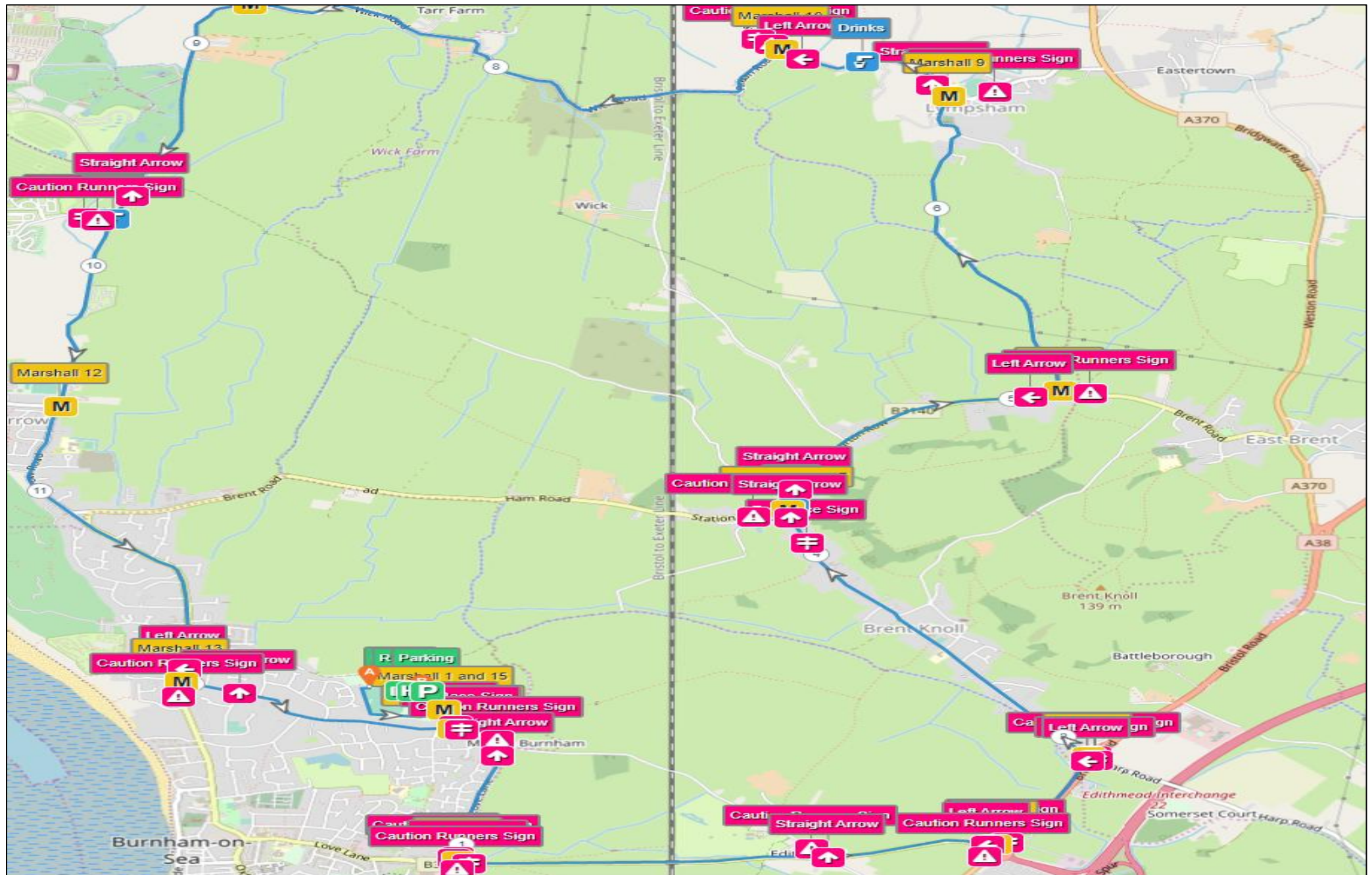

Spectators and children	- Spectators can line the course with the possible hazard of colliding with runners, either on the course or at the start/finish area. - Children/young people are in attendance, primarily at the BASC Sports Ground. Any lost children should be reported to marshals/Race Director to commence a search for the young person. The BASC Sports Ground is the main headquarters and where a child is relocated, they should be taken to the BASC Ground (bar area) to meet parents.			Start/finish area is funnelled to prevent spectators from entering the course but have the potential to cross the course. Race Director to be aware of lost child procedures. Burnham Harriers has a welfare officer present on race day. Burnham Harrier Run Leaders who support the race are safeguarding trained.
